

# INDIANA UNIVERSITY

**THE INFLUENCE OF THE UNIVERSITY** is felt in every corner of our community, with a youthful energy that permeates throughout. When you visit Bloomington, you have to visit the IU campus. Here's some info to help you get started.

Indiana University was founded in 1820 as the first state college west of the Allegheny Mountains. Originally, it was known as State Seminary and located on Second Street between College Avenue and Walnut Street (now called Seminary Park). A fire destroyed the original buildings in 1883 and the campus was moved to the current location.

The "old crescent" area, just east of the Sample Gates, features many of the original buildings, as well as the varied architectural styles and natural beauty of the campus. These are among the reasons IU has been called one of the five most beautiful campuses in the country in Thomas A. Gaines' book *The Campus as a Work of Art*.

Today, the university is home to 14 schools, many nationally ranked, and over 40,000 students, representing every state and more than 125 countries. This amount of diversity brings a wealth of opportunities and resources to the campus and city.

IU Art Museum—designed by famed architect I.M. Pei—featuring a massive collection that ranges from famous artwork by Picasso and Monet to rare pieces from ancient Greece, plus one of the best African art collections in the country. Another interesting art collection is that of the Kinsey Institute for Research in Sex, Gender and Reproduction, with artwork focused on the delicate subjects the institute researches.

You'll also want to check out the Jacobs School of Music, a highly-ranked music school that cultivates the talents of the country's best musicians, singers and ballet dancers. The school produces hundreds of performances a year, so there's always an opportunity to hear world-class music.

For many visitors, Indiana University is known as the home of the Hoosiers, and that means Big Ten sports! You can catch a game or match in over 20 sports all year long, from basketball to wrestling, soccer to swimming.
